

St. John's - did you know?

Fr. Michael Barron who succeeded Rev. David Power had the distinction of being the first priest to be ordained in St. John's and for that reason had a very special interest in the church. As Adm. his appointment coincided with the centenary of the church (1950). He set up a working committee which organised the building of a baptistery, the removal of the ornamental screens dividing the side altars from the sanctuary; removal of the large porches at the main and side entrances and the remodelling of the organ gallery. He was also responsible for the recessing of the confessional, the refurbishing of the altar rails at the side altars and the installation of the stained glass windows, each representing one of the seven sacraments. His successor Fr. Raphael Power completed the work including the repainting of the church, after the transfer of Fr. Barron.
